WREN is Wallowa Resources-Wallowa Mountain Institute's Friday field science adventure program for 5th-8th grade students who enjoy learning through experience. During each class students and knowledgeable field instructors will explore Wallowa County and participate in hands-on discovery about our diverse natural world and our connection to it.

This spring, get ready for maps and muddy boots, packs and specimens, scrapes and blisters, computers and critters, Penny and Dave...**SPRING WREN 2010**. Real science requires cunning, adventure, and teamwork. Are you up for the challenge? If so, join WREN's 2010 Ecology Adventure, a five-Friday quest to discover the unique ecosystems that make up Wallowa County. Together we will dig deep into exploring the land and the creatures and how they relate with each other.

Each Friday we will learn about ecology in Wallowa County through discussion, designing and carrying out experiments, and engaging in the wild firsthand. After five weeks of exploring and discovering, we will understand the basic dynamics of Wallowa County's creatures and habitats. Are you ready to think, hike, and play?



Where: We will visit a variety of locations all over the county.

How Much: Each class costs \$15 per student or \$60 for an entire 5-Friday course. *Scholarships available-please inquire.*

WREN Details

Each 5-Friday course this spring, from start to finish, will be filled with adventure and discovery.

Incentive to register for all 5 Fridays of a course:

- Students who attend an entire course will receive a Suunto Compass & Nalgene Water Bottle.
- Tuition for an entire course is \$60 (versus \$75).
- Students who apply for all 5 Fridays will be favored over those who sign up for less.

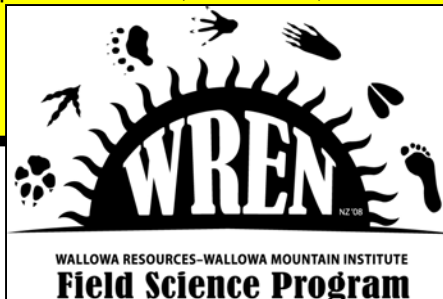
Student Expectations: WREN is a fun and educational program. We expect each student to be ready to participate and learn. Additionally, we expect students to be prepared to hike each class day with appropriate clothing for a range of weather conditions.

Wallowa Resources will provide:

- a) Instruction and supervision in the field.
- b) Round-trip transportation from the Wallowa County Education Service District (ESD) in Enterprise (107 SW 1st Street) to the field sites.
- c) A snack each day.

Students & Parents will need to provide:

- a) Transportation to & from the ESD in Enterprise (107 SW 1st Street).
- b) A lunch.
- c) Equipment- including:
 - daypack
 - warm layers (tops- preferably not cotton)
 - raingear
 - warm hat & gloves
 - sturdy shoes (close-toed) for hiking
 - water bottle(s)
 - pen/pencil
 - sunblock
 - Optional: camera, binoculars, sketchbook
